COMMUNICATION

Over the last week we have become increasingly concerned about the safety of some of our pupils at either end of the school day.

In the morning several children are waiting outside school by 8.15am. Apart from winter weather, which we will have at some point, White Woman Lane is a busy road and expecting children to stand still by the gate for half an hour is unrealistic. Pupils are supervised on the playground from 8.40am, please do not let them get to school beforehand. If there are exceptional circumstances please talk to the office staff, we can accommodate emergencies.

At the other end of the school day we have had children not knowing where they should be or knowing but not doing. We will talk to the children in assembly but I would be grateful if you would be clear with your children each morning about pick-up arrangements and reinforce to them the following procedures:

- If a pupil cannot find the adult collecting them they must return to the school office
- If a pupil joins an after school club this is a commitment and they are expected to be there, absences will be followed up.
- Pupils should never go home with someone else, even if they know them, unless this is a clear prior arrangement between parents

Finally, a plea. If another child **does** return home with your child and you are not sure of arrangements please phone the school office to let us know.



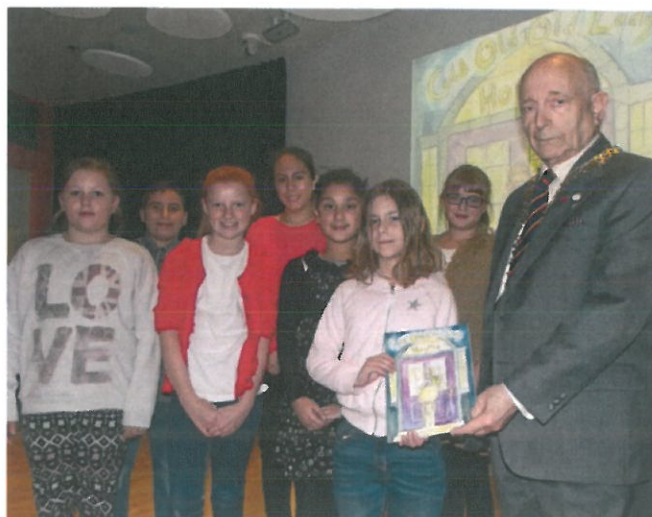
Library bus
