

School Text Message Service

We would like to remind you about our text messaging services.

Should we need to send you a text message we will do so from our general database system. The message will usually be brief due to a restriction on the number of characters able to be used.

Please note that as well as email and telephone the text messaging service may be used for reporting your child's absence from school. This is particularly useful in the mornings, when the office landline can often be extremely busy!



A FEW POLITE REMINDERS

Jewellery

For safety reasons, no jewellery should be worn in school. If pupils have pierced ears, only stud earrings are acceptable (only one pair of earrings at a time please!)

No jewellery of any description should be worn during P.E. or games. As an exception, ear studs in newly pierced ears should be covered for the first six weeks after piercing with an adhesive dressing tape for safety. Please provide tape for this purpose. After this period earrings should either be removed before school or by the child at school.

No earrings or studs are to be worn for swimming.

The school accepts no responsibility for injury or loss associated with the wearing of earrings.

Hair Bands

It is necessary for safety reasons that long hair should be tied back for Design Technology, Art and Design, some Science lessons, P.E. and Games. You are required to provide a suitable elastic band or hair tie for your child(ren). We recommend that children keep these with their P.E. kits or school bags at all times so they are readily available. Alternatively long hair could be tied up before the school.

Nail Varnish and Make Up

We would also like to remind you that nail varnish and make up is not appropriate for school.

Thank you for your co-operation in these matters.

HEAD UCE

We have had some reports that head lice have returned! The only way they can be controlled is if every parent checks their child's hair. If head lice are present the child should be treated.

Head lice are a medical and social problem and are NOT the responsibility of the school.

Head lice are well camouflaged and hide when disturbed by combing. They do not always cause itching particularly when recently arrived on the head. They may also be few in number and a quick inspection is unlikely to detect them.

The recommended method for checking is to use conditioner and a fine toothed comb, checking the comb for lice after each stroke as you work through the hair section by section, so that the whole head is combed through. Rinse out the conditioner and repeat the combing procedure in the wet hair.

If you find lice, treatment should be implemented using lotions obtainable from a pharmacist or by continuing with the wet combing method.



TALK HOMEWORK & WOW WORDS

Each week we send a Talk Homework activity and 'Wow' Words home and we would be very grateful for your support.


