TRAVELLING BOOK FAIR VISIT TO WWLS

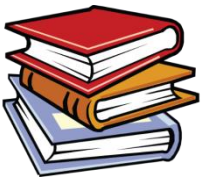

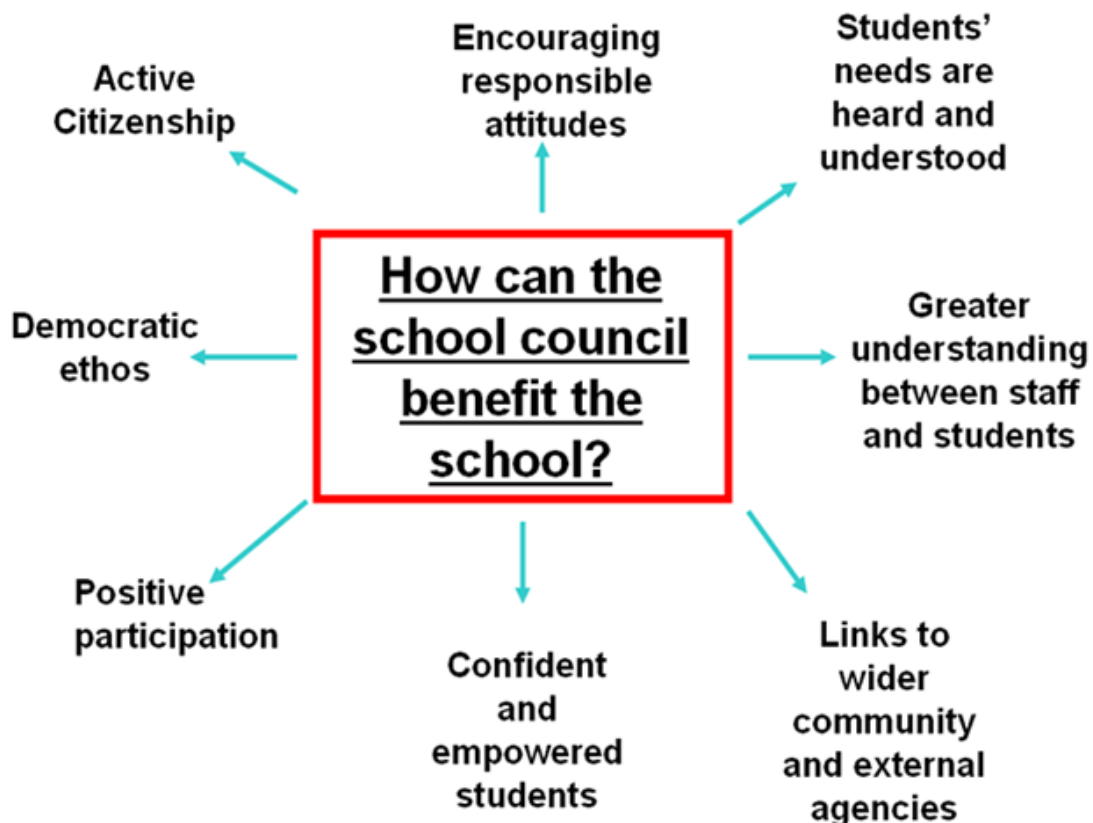
