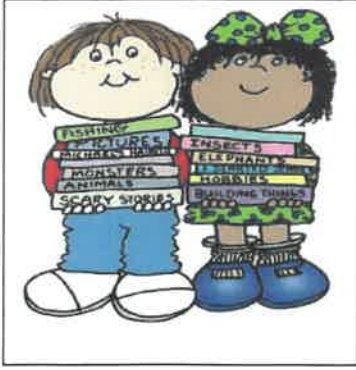


## KTroo

## Stage Books



Thanks to WWL Friends we have invested in over £4000 of new Stage books. Following feedback from School Council we have chosen titles that include new series edited by Michael Morpurgo and Jeremy Strong and a range of new non-fiction. We hope they will appeal to the children and be a much needed boost to books available for children to take home.

Stage Books will now range from 1 – 20 to come in line with Year 6 reading expectations.

We would encourage children to read their Stage books at least 2-3 times a week as part of their reading homework to ensure children are reading a range of fiction genres and non-fiction. Children are also able to borrow a book of their choice from the Library Bus.

After half-term if children in Years 4, 5 & 6 want their Stage book changed they will need to place their reading diary and book in the register basket at morning registration. School staff will then change their book for them. We will be trialling this for the next half-term to see if this assists with frequency of book changing. Children will no longer change books by themselves. Year 3 will change their books in the usual way.

Please take half-term as a chance to check for any books and return them no questions asked!
