## Introduction to Special Educational Needs and Disability (SEND)

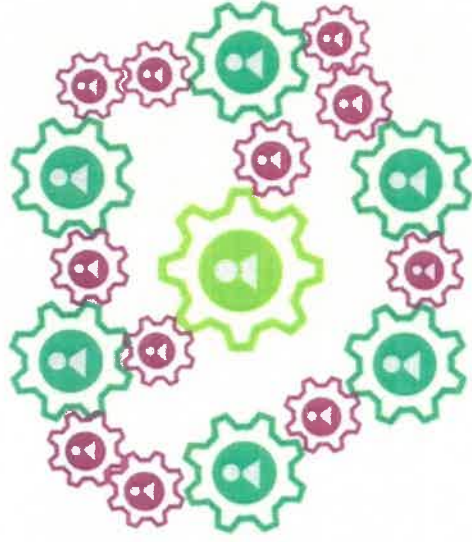

The SEND E-Learning will give learners a foundation knowledge and understanding of special educational needs and disability (SEND) in relation to children and young people aged 0-25.

## Why has it been developed?

The SEND E-Learning was commissioned to support the professional development of the wider workforce to understand their role and duties in relation to children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND).

It also aims to help parents and carers to better understand what to expect if their child has SEND.



It was co-produced by a small group with representation from:

- Children's Services - Education
- Children's Service - Social Care
- Health
- Adult Social Services
- Norfolk SEND Partnership
- Family Voice Norfolk

## What does it cover?

The course contains nine sections:

1. An introduction to SEND
2. Relevant legislation
3. SEN Support
4. EHC plans
5. Mediation and disagreement resolution
6. Preparing for adulthood
7. Health
8. Social care
9. Groups and organisations offering support



It also includes end of section assessments to demonstrate and reinforce learning.

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
