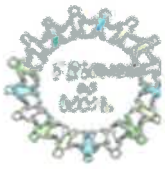


NON-UNIFORM DAY **FRIDAY 7TH JULY**

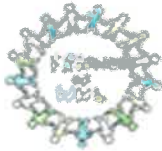
