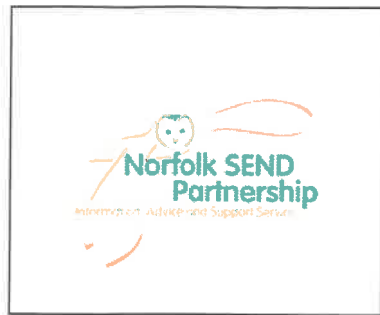
Individual photograph proofs and ordering forms were sent home this week.

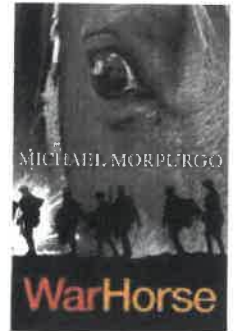

## **READING PROJECT**

World War 1

Monday 5<sup>th</sup> November – Friday 9<sup>th</sup> November 2018



We have many exciting things planned to promote reading during this project.

This year the Reading Week theme is World War 1 to commemorate 100 years since the end of the First World War. Lower school and upper school will have a different focus book based on World War 1.

Year 3 and 4: Where the Poppies Now Grow by Hilary Robinson & Martin Impey

Year 5 and 6: War Horse by Michael Morpurgo

During the week each class will read their focus book during Guided Reading sessions. They will spend the afternoon looking into different character's experiences and journeys through World War one. English lessons will focus on letter writing and the importance of that during that time. Each class will produce work that links with all areas of the curriculum whilst following a line of inquiry. All work will be displayed in an Exhibition the following week. Parents are welcome to view the Exhibition which will be up in the hall or art gallery after school throughout the week of Mon 12<sup>th</sup> Nov- Fri 16<sup>th</sup> Nov.

**Taking part in these Reading Projects have clear outcomes for the children;**

1. Improved progress in Communication, Language and Literacy
2. Positive attitudes to learning
3. Raised self-esteem and confidence
4. Enthusiasm for reading and books
5. Establish book/author preferences

The Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development has published research which showed that reading books as a family had the greatest impact on academic performance; this includes improvement in reading achievement, language comprehension, expressive language, interest and attitudes to reading and attentiveness in the classroom. I do hope you will enjoy reading any Roald Dahl books you have at home with your children. Thank you in advance for your support.

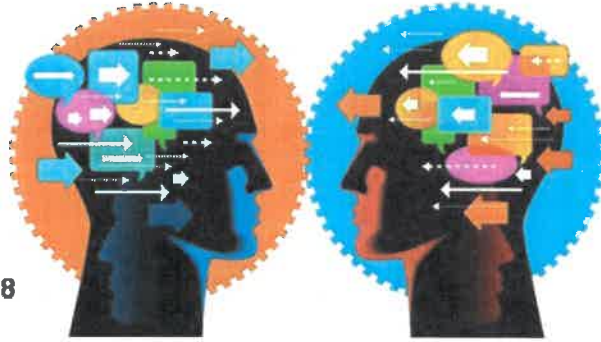
