## **Doggy Doo**

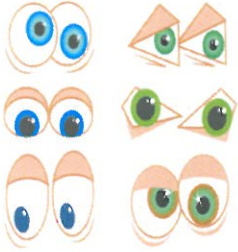


We are aware that, on a regular basis, there is dog excrement outside the main school gates. We have notified the enforcing authority, Broadland District Council, for their appropriate action.

## Eye Health and Vision Screening

Did you know that all children 5-16 years old should have a **free** vision and eye health check at least every two years at an opticians? Routine vision testing is offered to all Reception year children at school. If any problems are picked up at that point, children are referred to a hospital based paediatric eye clinic, but children's eyes change as they grow and some problems aren't obvious, which is why regular check-ups are important, just as you take your children regularly to the dentist. 'Look' out for the **Zookeeper Zoe** picture books with integrated eye tests for all children, in your local library or mobile library, to help get your child used to the idea of regular eye checks. Our school library also has a copy and some Boots Opticians may still have free copies left too.

## **School closures in adverse weather**



Many schools face difficulties as a result of adverse weather, particularly during periods of very low temperature and heavy snow. I am sure that you acknowledge that it is a difficult decision that sometimes has to be made as to whether to temporarily close the school for safety reasons and it is never a decision that is taken lightly.



In some circumstances closure is unavoidable, for example where there would not be enough staff on school sites to ensure pupil safety or the school site cannot be cleared sufficiently to be safe for all who attend the premises. We also have to take into account the travelling conditions and risk assess whether pupils, parents and staff can travel safely to and from school.

In a situation where there has been snowfall and our school is open, pupils will only be allowed to play outside, at lunch and break times, if they have suitable clothing and footwear i.e. Wellingtons/snow boots and warm clothing and overcoats.

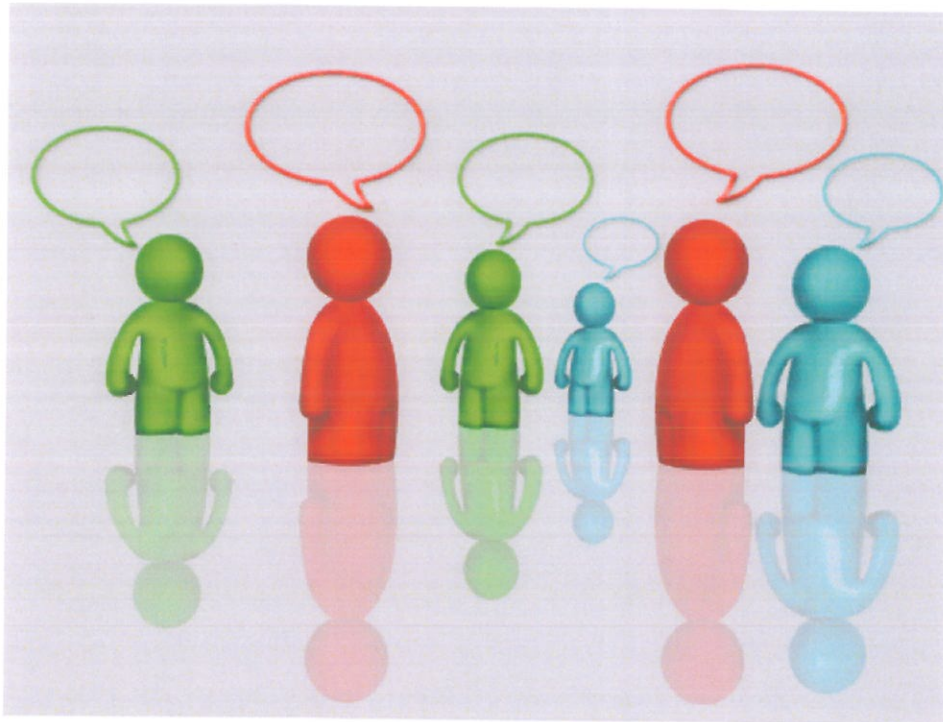
