P.E. T-shirts

We would like to clear up any confusion surrounding the subject of P.E. T-shirts! At the beginning of this school year we introduced the use of house coloured P.E. T-shirts on a phased basis. We invited our new intake of year 3's to supply a T-shirt in the colour of their designated House group as part of their P.E kit (we also extended the invitation to all pupils across the school if they so desired). This has never been a compulsory change as we fully understand that, regardless of their year group, children may have light blue polo shirts as part of their existing kit or indeed may have one passed to them from a sibling etc. We therefore have a situation where the majority of year 3 children and a few others in year's 4, 5 and 6 have a T-shirt in their house colour with the remainder of children having light blue polo shirts. Both options are completely acceptable however we do envisage that, in the years ahead, we are able to introduce house coloured T-shirts across the school.

Should you wish to purchase a house coloured T-shirt we have a limited supply available for the cost price of £3.00 available from the school office. You are obviously welcome to provide your own from alternative suppliers however these must be plain and without logo's and/or motifs.

THIS EVENING! - SCHOOL DISCO



The Friends of White Woman Lane have organised a school disco to enable our children to have fun and to also raise funds for the school.

The disco begins at 7.00pm and the children will not be let into school before then, so please ensure children do not arrive at school before this time. The main school entrance by the office is the door to use. Parents coming by car should note that, for safety reasons, the school car park cannot be used to drop children off.

The Friends charge £1.00 for entrance and children can bring some pocket money to buy drinks, snacks and glow sticks throughout the evening.

All pupils must be collected at the end of the evening by an adult.
