A total of £327.00 was raised by the Easter Egg raffle.

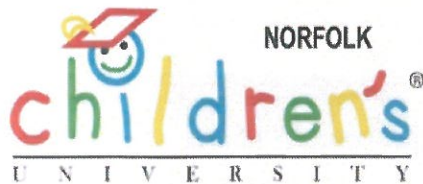

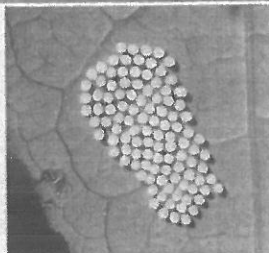

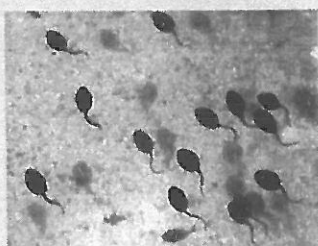
