
#### Hello!


It's been a busy time, with lots of books coming out one after the other. Not quite sure how it had happened, but ever since *Flamingo Boy* was published this summer, the books just keep coming along, like a convoy of buses!



So here they all are, in no particular order: In the Mouth of The Wolf; Our Jacko; Grandpa Christmas; my translation of The Little Prince by Antoine de Saint Exupery; and then there's my novel inspired by Raymond Briggs's great wordless book The Snowman; oh yes and I mustn't forget Poppy Field. I know that's an awful lot to read all at once, and you don't need to. Just read them one after the other, which is how I wrote them! I can tell you, they are all very different from one another. I like stories that take me to places and times I may not have been to before, and it's good for me to be telling my stories in a new way.











And because of all these books I have been running around like a mad chicken to festivals and events here there and everywhere, talking about them, writing articles about them, doing interviews about them. All of this has been great fun, because this way I get to meet my readers, young and old, talk to them, tell my stories, hear what they think, try to answer their questions. And then there are the concerts I do, live, or on the TV or the radio, concerts of *The Mozart Question, Poppy Field, The Best Christmas in the World, On Angel Wings.* I love doing that, weaving music and story, and I love telling my stories out loud. I think I'm more a storyteller than a writer.

There have been plays being performed of *Private Peaceful*, Why the Whales Came, Elephant in the Garden and War Horse, all of them travelling round the country and the world, so again telling the stories a different way and often to



new audiences. The National Theatre's wonderful production of *War Horse* is playing now, back where it all started thirteen years ago at the National Theatre. I was there on November the 11th, a hundred years exactly after the guns stopped firing and the First World War ended. An evening to remember. Eight million and more people have seen the play now, and it is about to set off on a new world tour next year. I hope to dress up in my costume and join the cast as I sometimes do. I love to feel part of this great adventure, to make believe I'm an actor, which I should have been in the first place. When you're

an actor you have to be someone else. Which means you can step outside yourself and see yourself and the world differently. I plan on being a proper actor when I grow up!

Come January though, I shall be settling down to write my new book. I know how it begins - I've written that bit. I think I know the middle, but I haven't got a clue how it will end. But that's good. If I don't know, then you won't either when you read it next year, which I hope you will, else what's the point of my writing it. It's called....... Not Telling You. So there!

Have a really Merry Christmas. Be happy.
