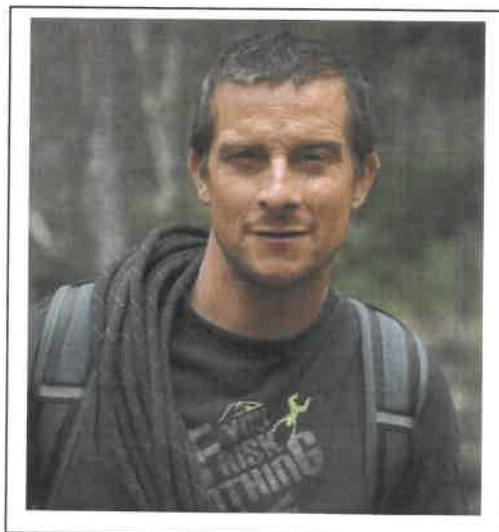
A love of reading improves a child's life beyond measure.
