Inter Area Under 11 Korfball Final – Sunday 13th May

The Copper Box Arena in London's Olympic Park was the venue this year for the Under 11s and Under 15s Inter Area Korfball Finals. The teams had qualified for the Finals in January in Harrow, and they joined the top 4 adult club teams in the country who had gathered for the Premier League Korfball plays offs (including Mr Dunn playing for Norwich Knights) and other adult sides who were vying for places to gain entry into the Premiership.

Thank you and a huge well done to Eva Hailes who played for the Norfolk Under 11s. The team (with other players from Avenues, St Williams Way and Sprowston) had trained hard in the 3 sessions prior to the tournament and played their best, but unfortunately could not overcome a strong Kent side. The half time score was 2-8 which did not reflect how well Norfolk were playing – their shots just were not going in and Kent scored nearly every time they shot! I was really proud of the way Norfolk kept fighting to come back, making some great interceptions in the second half to try and stop Kent scoring more goals. The final score was 11-3 to Kent. It was a great experience for the players to play in such an arena, supported by many parents and older players, and they fully deserved their silver medals after the match.

Norfolk Under 15s (which included ex-WWL pupil Hanna Sayer) began well, leading Kent at the start of the match, but Kent took the lead 4-3 just before half time. Unfortunately, Kent took all their shooting chances well and again Norfolk had to settle for silver; 10-4 was the final score. Norfolk teams, junior and senior, did not seem to have luck with their shots across the weekend, although Mr Dunn did score several amazing long shots in Knight's game versus Tornadoes, but they were not enough to gain a victory. Norwich City also lost out to Bristol who have now been promoted to the Premiership, which is good news for ex-WWL pupil Heidi Terrington (now Heidi Paton) who was playing for Bristol. It was lovely to see someone who began playing Korfball at WWL successful and helping to develop the sport in another part of the country.
