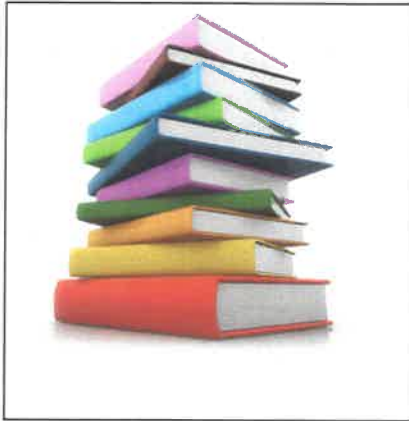


Talk Homework

For exceptional participation and attitudes towards lessons. She is making a massive effort and her learning is coming on leaps and bounds.

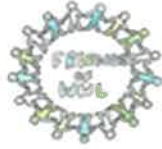
