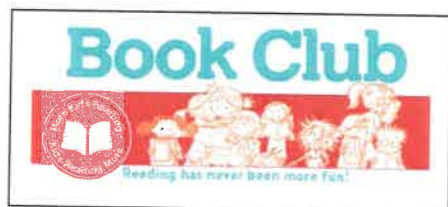


Athletics

How about the challenge of the 'Bumper Holiday Read' pack on the back cover of the leaflet. 20 books for £19.99... That's a saving of nearly £100!

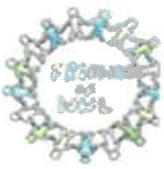

Haulage Traffic on White Woman Lane

Concern has been raised regarding the volume of heavy haulage vehicles passing the school at key drop off and pick up times. This traffic is due to the Northern Distributor Road. Following contact made with Norfolk County Council, one of our parents received the following response:

"I have established that these vehicles are carrying material being excavated from the NDR drainage lagoons close to the new Buxton Road bridge NDR and are transporting it to the embankments being created for bridges east of the Norwich to Sheringham railway. Unfortunately, the railway prevents this from being hauled along the route of the NDR itself. There is no ideal route for this road traffic, and returning empty trucks cannot turn right off the Ring Road directly into Spixworth Rd/Buxton Rd, so have to use North Walsham Road and White Woman Lane. The concerns of parents were raised at a meeting this morning and Balfour Beatty will be trying to minimise the use of this route during the times when children are going to and from school, particularly in the afternoon when they are heading home.

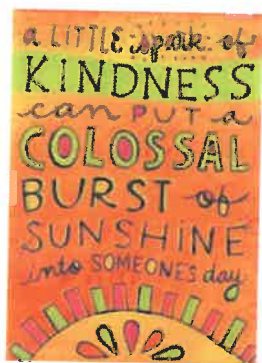
TALK HOMEWORK & 'WOW' WORDS

Online Safety Evening – The Breck Foundation

White Woman Lane School, Sprowston, Norwich

With special guest speaker, Lorin LaFave

Lorin, a Teaching Assistant from Surrey, came to the nation's attention in 2014 following the murder of her son, Breck Bednar (14), who was groomed via online gaming platforms and murdered on 17th February 2014. Breck's story was the subject of the BBC documentary 'Murder Games: The Life and Death of Breck Bednar' which was aired in early 2016.

Since Breck's death, Lorin has set up the Breck Foundation to raise awareness on internet safety. She speaks at schools, conferences, to parents and police and we are delighted to welcome her to the Nebula Partnership and hope as many people as possible will attend to hear her powerful and sometimes harrowing story told in her own words. Lorin will also be available for questions after her presentation.
