Nicola has a long list of brilliant titles, all concerning the natural world. She is a Zoologist and Conservationist, ex TV presenter and smallholder and has written a wide range of fiction and non-fiction titles including –

The Elephant Road (Heroes of the Wild series)
Big Blue Whale

Her talks will cover nature and ecology as well as her writing so linking with STEM strands Science and Literacy. Nicola also works with a charity called the World Land Trust.
