

School opening times

Parents and carers are reminded that children should not arrive onto school premises until 8.40am at the earliest, from which time a member of staff will be on duty.

The school gates are left open earlier in the mornings enabling year 7+ pupils to cut through on their way to high school. This does not mean however that school is open to our pupils at this time.

HEAD LICE

We have had some reports that head lice have returned! The only way they can be controlled is if every parent checks their child's hair and if head lice are present, treats the child.

Head lice are well camouflaged and hide when disturbed by combing. They do not always cause itching particularly when recently arrived on the head. They may also be few in number and a quick inspection is unlikely to detect them.

It is recommended to use conditioner and a fine toothed comb to comb the hair thoroughly, checking the comb for lice after each stroke as you work through the hair section by section. Rinse out the conditioner and repeat the combing procedure in the wet hair.

If you find lice they can be treated using lotions obtainable from a pharmacist or by using the wet combing method.
