TALK HOMEWORK & 'WOW' WORDS

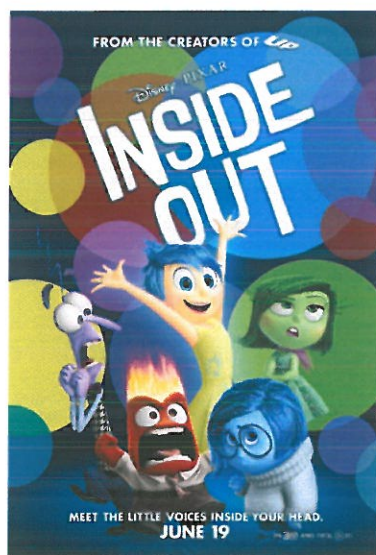
Each week we send a **Talk Homework** activity and **'Wow' Words** home and we would be very grateful for your support.

Emotion



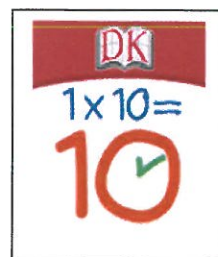
(feeling, sentiment, sensation, reaction, response) Please encourage your child to use this word, in the right context, as much as possible.
