School closures in adverse weather

Many schools face difficulties as a result of adverse weather, particularly during periods of very low temperature and heavy snow. I am sure that you acknowledge that it is a difficult decision that sometimes has to be made as to whether to temporarily close the school for safety reasons and it is never a decision that is taken lightly.

In some circumstances closure is unavoidable, for example where there would not be enough staff on school sites to ensure pupil safety or the school site cannot be cleared sufficiently to be safe for all who attend the premises. We also have to take into account the travelling conditions and risk assess whether pupils, parents and staff can travel safely to and from school.

Information regarding whether White Woman Lane School is closed and a list of all schools which are closed can be found on the website www.schoolclosures.norfolk.gov.uk. As well as publishing the information on the web, Norfolk County Council will also highlight closures on our Facebook and Twitter channels, using the hashtag #norfolkwinter.

In a situation where there has been snowfall and our school is open, pupils will only be allowed to play outside, at lunch and break times, if they have suitable clothing and footwear i.e. Wellingtons/snow boots and warm clothing and overcoats.

We are trying to help all our children develop excellent speaking and listening skills, which in turn will help them with their writing. "If a child can't say a sentence then they can't write it either!"



New Menu for February 2016 – A message from Norse

HEAD LICE

We have had reports that head lice have returned! The only way they can be controlled is if every parent checks their child's hair and if head lice are present, treats the child.

Top tips for checking and treating:

Head lice are well camouflaged and hide when disturbed by combing. They do not always cause itching particularly when recently arrived on the head. They may also be few in number and a quick inspection is unlikely to detect them.

The recommended method is to use conditioner and a fine toothed comb, checking the comb for lice after each stroke as you work through the hair section by section, so that the whole head is combed through. Rinse out the conditioner and repeat the combing procedure in the wet hair.

If you find lice, you can treat using lotions obtainable from a pharmacist or by continuing to use the wet/conditioner combing method.



SWIMMING:



During their time in year 4 our pupils take part in swimming lessons to improve their competence and confidence in the water. As we do not have our own pool we take the pupils to Drayton Junior School to use their facilities. Many of you will have heard that the pool is in desperate need of repair and refurbishment and will remain closed until these take place. The

pool is particularly valuable as it is one of very few 'learner pools' locally and was used continuously by children from schools and clubs all over Norwich. Whilst Drayton Junior receives money from Norfolk County Council to run the pool, as well as money from hirers, there is no funding provided for the huge capital repairs and improvements the pool desperately needs. Drayton Junior is hoping to achieve grant funding to contribute to this but they will need extra support from the local community.

Without this additional support the pool will remain closed.

Drayton Junior has launched an appeal asking the local community for help by donating just




