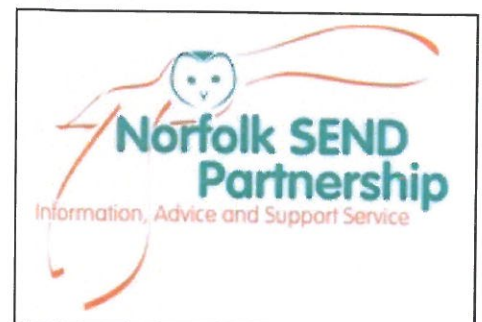
Norfolk SEND Partnership

We are trying to help all our children develop excellent speaking and listening skills, which in turn will help them with their writing. "If a child can't say a sentence then they can't write it either!"

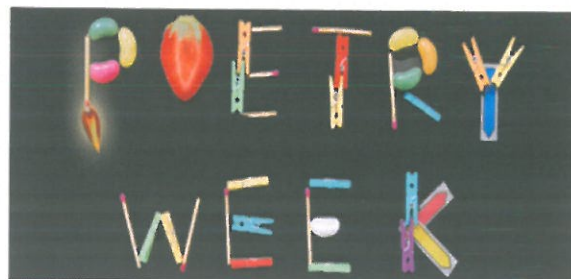
Please spend at least 10 minutes talking with your child about the questions below;

A Kenning is a two word phrase describing an object often using a **metaphor**. A Kennings poem is a **riddle** made up of several lines of kennings to describe something or someone.

What is the structure of a Kennings poem?

A Kennings poem consists of several **stanzas** of two describing words. It can be made up of any number of Kennings.
