




the country. We aim to provide a unique experience that will support the children's learning in science and writing. To make the experience



# TALK HOMEWORK & WOW WORDS

Each week we send a Talk Homework activity and 'Wow' Words home and we would be very grateful for your support.

We are trying to help all our children develop excellent speaking and listening skills, which in turn will help them with their writing. "If a child can't say a sentence then they can't write it either!"

Please spend at least 10 minutes talking with your child about the questions below;

We have been talking a lot in school over the past few weeks about esafety and how to stay safe while we are using devices that connect us to the internet. One of the most critical things that we can all do is to talk to each other. Parents and carers to talk to their children about what they are doing online, what they are writing and who they are communicating with. Children to talk to their parents and carers if they are unsure of what they have seen online or if they are receiving anything that upsets them. This week I want you to discuss with your families the SMART rules!



<u>Safe</u> - keeping your personal information private. <u>Meeting</u> - never meet someone that you have only met online.

Accepting - do not accepting emails or open attachments that you are unsure of; it could lead to viruses or damage to your devices.

Reliable - check information on the internet at least 3 times in different places to check that it is reliable.

<u>Tell</u> - tell an adult you trust if something makes you worry or feel scared.




