**30th May is National Loomis Day! Do you know who Mahlon Loomis was? We want you to find out all about Loomis Day and why it should be in our minds. You can either write an article, create a poster or perhaps even write a poem telling us why people celebrate Loomis Day! 1 credit**

**Decode the following by making our special decoder: WKHUH DUH ORWV RI GLIIHUHQW FRGHV. You will need two paper disks (same size), a pen, scrap paper, a split pin, scissors (with adult supervision). The method – Around the edge of one disk, write the alphabet in capitals, clockwise. Once you have done this, under “D”, start again at “a” and write the alphabet again, clockwise, in lowercase, under the capital letters. Place the other disk over the first and cut a slit in the edge, so you can see one capital letter and the other letter underneath it. Fix the two disks together with the split pin. For each code letter, find it in capitals by turning the top disk and write the lower case letter you see on your scrap paper. How does it work? This code disk has the code letters in capitals and the real letters in lower case. FEELING AMBITIOUS? For an extra CU Credit Create your own coded message using this code, and share with us on social media or via email and we will see if anyone can decode it. This code is called the Ceasar Shift! Up to 2 credits.**
