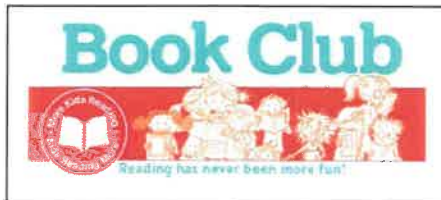

How about the challenge of the 'Bumper Holiday Read' pack on the back cover of the leaflet. 20 books for £19.99... That's a saving of nearly £100!



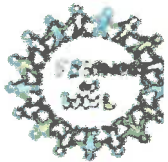

Also any cuddly toys and books in good condition.

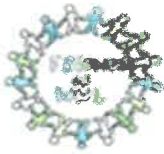


NON-UNIFORM DAY FRIDAY 7TH JULY

The disco begins at 7.00pm and the children will not be let into school before then, so please ensure children do not arrive at school before this time. The main school entrance by the office is the door to use. Parents coming by car should note that, for safety reasons, the school car park cannot be used to drop children off. Please be aware that the side gates will be locked. The

Friends charge £1.00 for entrance and children can bring some pocket money to buy drinks and snacks throughout the evening.

All pupils must be collected at the end of the evening by an adult. Children leave the hall through the main entrance and we suggest you meet your children in the car park and by the main school gate. The school gate is closed so cars cannot use the car park at the end of the disco. We stagger the finish to make it a little easier to reunite parents and children as follows;

- Year 3 will leave at 8.50pm
- Year 4 will leave at 8.55pm
- Years 5 and 6 will leave at 9.00pm.

Active Kids Vouchers

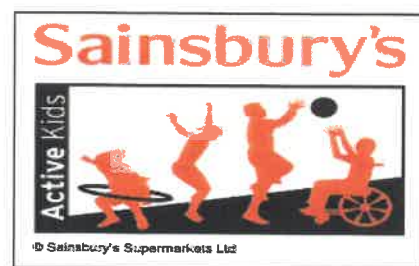
Rally the community, every voucher counts

Robot Engineers

Would your child like to be a Robot Engineer? If so this Holiday Club is for them! The day consists of building, designing and coding a Robot to complete the challenges set by Evil Engineer Stuart!

This Holiday Club will be a full day event inspiring young minds in the world of robotics and computer programming.

JitterBugs

The JitterBugs holiday club will allow your child the opportunity to create their very own creature (a battery powered jitterbug), diving into the wild world of unusual creatures. The jitterbugs can also be taken home at the end of the day!

This Holiday club will allow your child to learn about different types of creatures and habitats in the world.

Stuck in Space

Stuck in Space is a holiday club where the children will work in teams to rescue a team member who is stuck outside the spaceship! The teams will have a box of resources from which they need to design a rescue pod. The teams will have to design a structure to support the lost team member without touching the fiery lava floor of a distance planet.

This holiday club will allow your children to explore engineering and designing structure fit for purpose, as well as problem solving and teamwork.

The Marble Coaster

The Marble Coaster is a session where children will use cardboard to design a marble run. They will need to design a run which lasts for a minimum of 30 seconds and with the view to making it as fast as possible.

This Holiday Club will turn your child into a mini engineer as they will have to learn about potential energy, friction, angles of the slope, different material properties and have fun!
