## **HEAD LICE**

We have had some reports that head lice have returned! The only way they can be controlled is if every parent checks their child's hair and if head lice are present, treats the child.

Head lice are well camouflaged and hide when disturbed by combing. They do not always cause itching particularly when recently arrived on the head. They may also be few in number and a quick inspection is unlikely to detect them.

Use conditioner and a fine toothed comb, checking the comb for lice after each stroke as you work through the hair section by section, so that the whole head is combed through. Rinse out the conditioner and repeat the combing procedure in the wet hair.

If you find lice, treat using lotions obtainable from a pharmacist or by using the wet combing method.

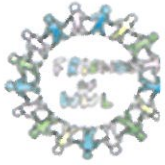

All children may attend school in non- uniform on Friday 24<sup>th</sup> June

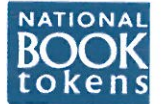
### **But a fine will need to be paid!**

## WHITLINGHAM TRIP

Each day the children will need to bring:

- Plenty to drink (not fizzy and no glass bottles please)
- Lunch and snacks
- Waterproofs
- 2 sets spare clothes plus plastic bag for any wet clothes
- 1 pair of trainers on their feet which they will keep dry, and 1 pair of old trainers for the water.
- 2 Towels
- Sunscreen



I suggest that the children wear old T shirts, sweatshirts (it can be cold by the water), and shorts or tracksuit bottoms depending on the weather. Avoid jeans as denim is uncomfortable when wet.

If your child requires any medication during the day please ensure that it is named and labelled with the correct dosage. Your child should hand it to their group leader at the beginning of each day.

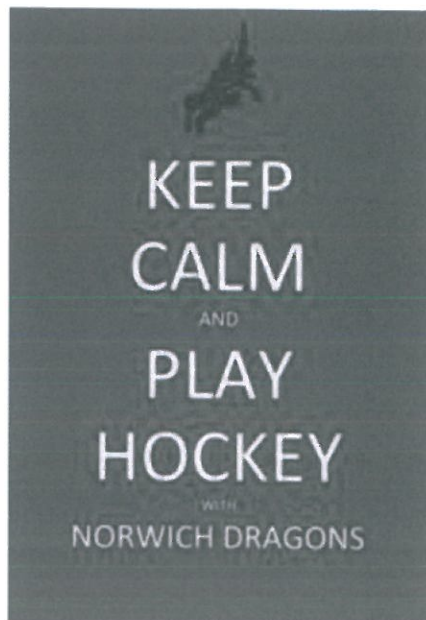

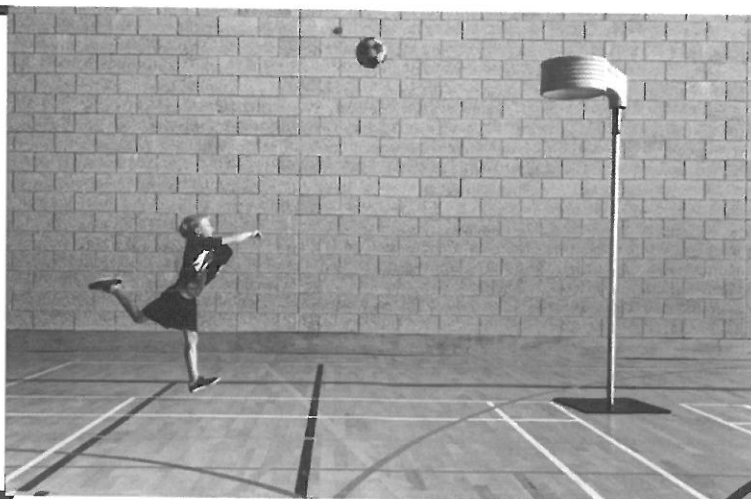
