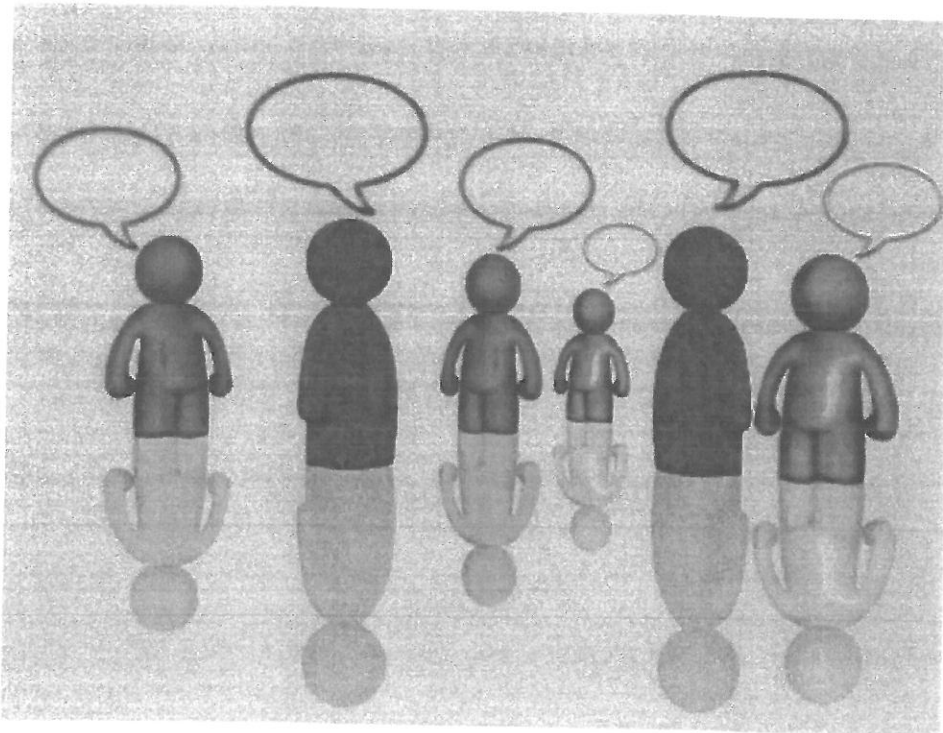
Please come along and just have a chat, or ask anything about support for your child.

I would like to include some training for parents as the year goes on, so please come and have your views heard!



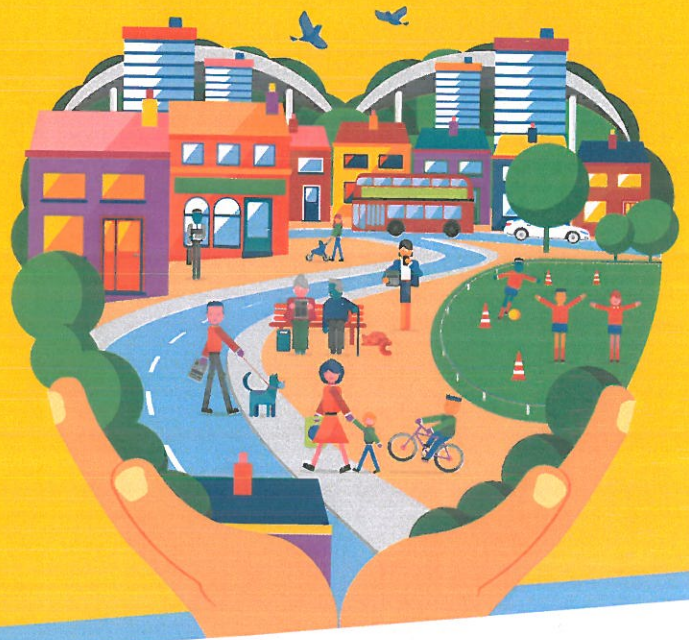
