YEAR 6

END OF KS2 TEST RESULTS

The results are back and pupil's individual achievements have been reported to parents.

In the SATs tests this year children received a scaled score between 80 and 120.

Any child getting 100 or more achieved the expected standard. Those below did not.

At the moment there is no official 'greater depth' level but I have included figures based on where we think it might be.
