Korfball Tournament Report

On Saturday 21st November Year 3 took part in their first Korfball tournament at Eaton CNS. There were 5 school teams, plus 4 club teams who had come along for some match practice and friendly games. There were 3 WWL teams (Blues, Sky and Greens) playing 4v4 (instead of 8v8) mono-korfball. Each team played 3 matches and the newly formed schools teams played very well against the club sides.

In this game of end to end play, players need to change between attack and defence very quickly; I was impressed by all the players' growing awareness of how important it is in Korfball to be a good close marking defender in order to prevent the opposition from scoring. The Sky and Green team were very unlucky not to score but the WWL Blues won 2 matches, beating Sprowston Reds 4-0 with superb goals from Lewis (2), Callum and Romy, and Sprowston Blues 3-0 with a hat trick of goals from Lewis – wow! This meant that WWL Blues won the shield (the first time WWL has won the Y3 Autumn shield!) WWL Sky came 3rd and WWL Greens 4th.

Well done to all the Y3 players, a very promising Korfball squad – Eva, Romy, Spencer, Callum and Lewis; Carmen, Charlotte, Amelia, Henry and Leo; Ruby, Lucy, Nelson and Bailey.
