School Disco - Friday 6th December

**The Friends of White Woman Lane have organised a school disco to enable our children to have fun and to also raise funds for the school.**

The disco begins at 7.00pm and the children will not be let into school before then, so please ensure children do not arrive at school before this time. The main school entrance by the office is the door to use. Parents coming by car should note that, for safety reasons, the school car park cannot be used to drop children off.

The Friends charge £1.00 for entrance and children can bring some pocket money to buy drinks, snacks and glow sticks throughout the evening.

- Drinks        Fizzy 20p, Squash 10p
- Sweets        from 5p
- Glow Sticks, Bracelets, Glasses, Bunny Ears, necklaces, pendants  
all from 50p. Pocket money toys from 50p.

All pupils must be collected at the end of the evening by an adult. Children leave the hall through the main entrance and we suggest you meet your children in the car park and by the main school gate. The school gate is closed so cars cannot use the car park at the end of the disco. We stagger the finish to make it a little easier to reunite parents and children as follows;

- Year 3 will leave at 8.50pm
- Year 4 will leave at 8.55pm
- Years 5 and 6 will leave at 9.00pm.

These procedures are tried and tested and have worked well in the past so we are all looking forward to an enjoyable evening for the children.



## Medication in School



**Please remember that medication includes cough and throat sweets, nasal sprays, topical creams and vapour rubs. Children should not have any medication in their pockets or bags. All medicines (except asthma inhalers which are kept by the child) must be handed in to the school office, preferably by an adult.**

It is important that you let us know of any medical problems your child may have (temporary or long term). We ask that, whenever possible, medicines are administered by parents at home. If it is necessary to ask us to administer medicines in school, we ask you and your child to follow these procedures in the interests of your child's health and well being.

1. All medicines (including asthma inhalers) must be clearly labelled with the child's name, dosage and frequency of dosage. You are required to complete a form, available from the office or on our school website <http://www.whitewomanlane.norfolk.sch.uk/for-parents-2/medication-in->

2. All medicines (except asthma inhalers which are kept by the child) must be handed in to the school office, preferably by an adult. This include cough sweets, nasal sprays, topical creams and vapour rubs
3. The child must report to the school office at the agreed time for his/her medicine for supervised administration.

## Parking

We would be grateful if you would be considerate about where you park at the beginning and end of the school day, ensuring that you do not block our neighbours' driveways and do not park on the grass verges. This will help us retain good relationships with the local community. Could we also remind parents that for reasons of safety, only taxis are permitted to collect children from the school car park at the end of the school day.

## Head Lice

We have had some reports that head lice have returned! The only way they can be controlled is if every parent checks their child's hair. If head lice are present the child should be treated.

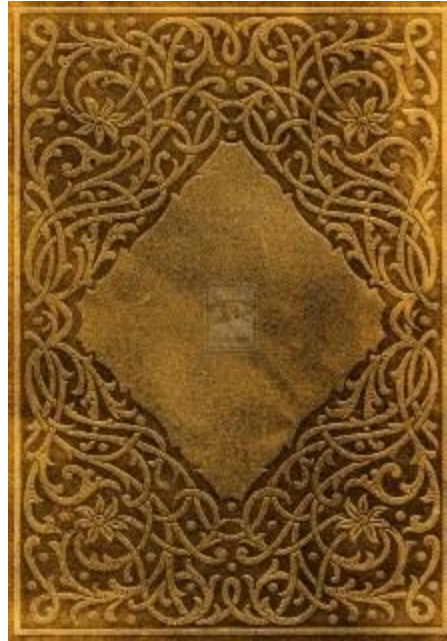
Head lice are a medical and social problem and are NOT the responsibility of the school.

Head lice are well camouflaged and hide when disturbed by combing. They do not always cause itching particularly when recently arrived on the head. They may also be few in number and a quick inspection is unlikely to detect them.

The recommended method for checking is to use conditioner and a fine toothed comb, checking the comb for lice after each stroke as you work through the hair section by section, so that the whole head is combed through. Rinse out the conditioner and repeat the combing procedure in the wet hair.

If you find lice, treatment should be implemented using lotions obtainable from a pharmacist or by continuing with the wet combing method.
