Balance B/F £4644	Contribution to new Federation minibus purchased 19.11.20 (Total cost £19,300)	Competitions and festivals will restart as soon as government guidelines permit. Having transport
£5000	Maintenance and insurance of minibuses. Employment of driver	enables more pupils to access more events. An employed driver enables a greater number of staff, not qualified to drive, to accompany children to fixtures and sporting events thus raising the whole school profile of physical education.
£525	Basketball posts to maintain the range of opportunity.	Pupils will be able to access the equipment during lessons/play times/extra curricular activities.  The posts purchased can be adjusted to differing heights allowing all pupils access.
£150	Additional mats to ensure all mats are completely sealed and there are sufficient mats to avoid pupils getting too close to one another.	Gymnastics can be taught as comprehensively as is possible within government guidelines giving children space to practise skills.
