£6000	Increased access to high quality curriculum physical education through the employment of specialist teachers who work closely with school staff to upskill and develop professionally	
£500	Employment of a driver to increase access to competition.	
£200	P.E. subject lead released to work with county representative to improve assessment.	
£1400	Extra-curricular clubs offered to pupils at no cost. This develops skills, knowledge and understanding and raises self-esteem. Pupils are able to act as role models during curriculum lessons.	
£1570	Extra-curricular dance offered to pupils at no cost, developing flexibility, strength, control, performance skills, musicality and spatial awareness. Pupils are able to act as role models during curriculum lessons.

COST	PROPOSAL	EXPECTED IMPACT
£800	Top-up swimming in the summer term for Yr.6 pupils not yet meeting NC requirements. Costs are related to transport and hiring of pool and instructor.	100% of the Yr. 6 cohort will swim confidently and proficiently over 25metres.
£11500	Specialist physical education staff will teach pupils and provide staff with professional development, mentoring and resources. Costs are related to employment costs.	Standards in the teaching of physical education will continue to rise and pupils' skill level, participation and enjoyment will increase. The sustainability is self-evident when increasing numbers of staff, including NQTs and SCITT students have the opportunity to work alongside specialists.
£200	Inset for all staff understanding the advantages of teaching Korfball as part of the primary curriculum and giving them the skills to do so. Costs are related to employment costs of inset delivery.	Increased staff confidence in teaching. Increased pupil enjoyment leading to participation beyond the curriculum and beyond education.
£795	Pupils will continue to compete in SSP arranged competition; local leagues and, increasingly, in Nebula competitions and festivals as the partnership with the Community Sports Foundation develops and a new local venue becomes available. Costs are related to subscriptions; transport; purchase of Nebula trophies; supply costs covering attending staff; hiring of venue and provision of referees/coaches.	We aim to increase the participation of our pupils in regular competition by 50%.
£200	Attendance at all available adapted games events organised through the SSP. Costs are related to transport and staff cover.	Pupils with SEND benefit hugely in participating in adapted sports/games, primarily in areas of self-esteem, enjoyment, courage.

£1 000	Establishing more structured active playtimes by employing an instructor to work with mid-day supervisors, up-skilling them to organise activities raising physical output for all pupils. Costs are related to employing an instructor.	Most pupils will be active, leading to healthier lifestyles and reducing obesity. Pupils will learn to interact more positively, improving social cooperation. (SMSC). By working with mid-day supervisors they will gain confidence and knowledge enabling them to deliver active lunchtimes in their own setting.
